Working on a set for the week, meant I was able to get a sense of familiarity of the location, which helped in maintaining a smooth operation and continuing a level of professionalism. I was responsible for the tea table, constantly attending to it and keeping it fully stocked. I had to escort high profile talent to and from the green room, along with collecting and plating their dinner from the canteen. Also, I was on a constant errand run, back and forth to the production trailer. Between these tasks and more, as one of a group of runners, we had to also balance keeping on top of the sound stage bell: making sure it was always attended to and rung when required. We transferred over to Black Island Studios' green screen sound stage for two days, which meant we had to adapt and replicate our regular set up.

- Trigonometry (BBC Two) - Runner/Shadowed Script Editor - House Productions - May 2019

I worked as a runner during the first week. Everyday we were at a different location, so I had to quickly get familiar with the crew and the tasks at hand. Working closely with a team of runners, we had to lock off the set to both the public and crew, keeping any disturbances away from set. Other tasks were assigned to me, for example, ensuring all breaks and lunches were set up and running smoothly, fetching cast members, and filling in as an extra on two occasions. During the second week I shadowed the Script Editor back in the offices. I analysed the first four scripts, and then treatments for all episodes. I had to scrutinise and discuss consistencies in the core characters throughout the series, along with critiquing the plots and dialogue.

During this work experience I shadowed the Floor Manager and assisted him when needed. After getting a tour of the studio and gallery, I was given a talkback earpiece that let me hear directly what was being said by the director in the control room at all times. Also, I was given running order scripts to keep track of what was happening when. One of the responsibilities I had was ensuring the props were where they needed to be whilst the VTs were running. This

meant I had to be observant and quick and on the ball, watching and hearing out for cues.
